## NUMERACY TARGETS

- Find remainders after division.
- Know the language of capacity, read scales and be able to deal with related problems.
- Interpret and use information pictorially.
- Know the names of 3D shapes and understand their properties, such as number and type of angles etc.
- Recognise simple fractions that are several parts of a whole and simple equivalence.
- Find fractions of an amount.
- Be able to carry out column addition and subtraction with numbers up to 1000.
- Choose and use appropriate number operations, mentally and in their written work.
- Know the 8 points of the compass.
- Calculate the area and perimeter of shapes.
